- Ellie and her friends attend Grover Cleveland High School. The school colors are orange and teal.
- ☐ The show depicts some family and school issues that may be upsetting or spark questions for some. For example:
- Before the events of the story, Ellie and Fletcher's father, Katherine's first husband, has died. His death and the family's grieving process are discussed.
- The students at Grover Cleveland High School do not always get along and there is confrontation, especially between Ellie and Savannah.
- There are some references to general teenage rebellion, the use of tobacco, and the alleged use of other drugs, but there is no actual depiction of tobacco or drug use.
- Freaky Friday shows us how selfless, sacrificial love and understanding help heal wounds of division and conflict.


